Please also come along to Room 3 to bid on your children's amazing artwork. They will be displayed on the back wall and bidsheets will be nearby.

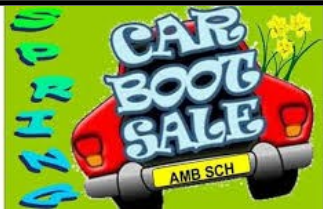
